WINE TRAIL

Awaiting hikers and wine lovers alike is an abundance of flora, fauna and biological diversity throughout the countless stops, both large and small, along the Fellbach Wine Trail.

SPECIAL EXPERIENCE BESINNUNGSWEG

PATH OF REFLECTION OEFFINGEN

People of every age can come here in search of art, literature and religion. The three kilometer and two-hour long tour takes visitors past various works by renowned artists (such as Micha Ullmann, Inge Mahn, Henk Visch, Jürgen Brodwolf, Timm Ulrichs and more). Additionally, the Besinnungsweg thrills with its view of the Kappelberg, the Korber Kopf and even the Stuttgart TV Tower. The panorama is one of a kind: Wanderers will find themselves both in the middle of nature and in the middle of life – between fields, forests and meadows and among religious, cultural and philosophical landmarks. In other words: Visitors not only encounter a special place rife with unique experiences, but they can also find themselves, far away from the daily routine.

ADDITIONAL RECOMMENDATIONS OEFFINGEN | SCHMIDEN

GROSSES HAUS SCHMIDEN

This impressive farmstead was built in 1577 and today houses the Schmiden City Library and the Orfeo Cinema. Along with big cinematic showings, the vaulted cellar regularly holds smaller art functions, jazz shows and other events.

FELDKAPELLE HEILIG KREUZ OEFFINGEN

Constructed around 1600, the Feldkapelle Heilig Kreuz ("Holy Cross Field Chapel") in Oeffingen is situated along a historical transport route. The interior of the chapel woos visitors with beautiful ceiling frescos and gilded stucco ornamentation. Additionally, the Fellbach Besinnungsweg begins at its doorstep.

SCHLÖSSLE OEFFINGEN

This historical building (the "Schlössle") is one of the three main historical buildings in Oeffingen – along with the "Türmle" on Schulsstrasse and the former "Obervogtei" (Office of the High Governor) on Hauptstrasse – that have been preserved since the rule of Augsburg Cathedral Chapter (1619–1803) and are always well worth a visit.

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WELCOME TO THE CITY WALKING TOUR FELLBACH

Take a stroll to discover Fellbach's city centre at a relaxed pace and on your own. We've prepared a walking tour that guides you through our beautiful city and takes you to a number of sights, which we present to you below.

1 | CITY LIBRARY

Surrounded by attractive stores, offices, clinics and apartments, the City Library at Berliner Platz (Berlin Square) comprises the heart of the "living city". This heart not only pulses with books, media and over 10 000 readers annually, but also inspires with its enthralling architecture. And it's no wonder that the quadrant-shaped building designed by Stuttgart architect Arno Lederer and inaugurated in 1987 has won various awards nationwide. The library itself is also acclaimed for its service, quality and diverse assortment.

2 | LUTHER CHURCH

Built in 1518, this church stands as the city's historical landmark and fascinates visitors with its array of special features. Some examples include its late-Gothic west tower with a crucifixion group from the 30-Years War, the seven masterworks titled "Cross Station Jesus" (created in Augsburg between 1730 and 1740), the rococo cased organ from the 18th century, and the church's sacristy vaults. The same site was home to a church consecrated to Saint Gall as early as the 13th century, which was later expanded into a fortified and sanctuary church in the 15th century complete with a protective moat.

3 | NEW TOWN HALL

This building, designed by Zurich architect Ernst Gisell, was constructed between 1984 and 1987 and, in addition to the City Hall itself, also houses a cafe, two restaurants and the City Gallery. It has received top architectural acclaim on both the state and the national levels. Additionally, the New City Hall attracts visitors with a particular rarity: the city hall glocken-

spiel made of Meissen porcelain, a gift from Fellbach's sister city in Saxony. Also notable and well worth seeing: the spacious courtyard of the city hall, which turns into an open-air cafe in the summertime containing a sculpture by Swiss sculptor Otto Müller.

4 | CITY MUSEUM

The former community center was built in 1682 and is now one of the city's most historical and architecturally riveting buildings: It belonged to the Ebensberger family for 200 years, was inhabited by the surgeons Irion and Koch from 1838 to 1891, and then became part of the Funksche Garden in 1899. After an extensive renovation, the building reopened as a museum in 2011. One of the special attractions is the Mörike Gallery with its centerpiece "Mörike and the Ladies". Changing exhibits constantly bring new life to the museum.

5 | SCHWABENLANDHALLE

The Fellbach Schwabenlandhalle is not only a conference, exhibition and congress center, it is also the first stop for all fans of special events and the "fine arts". Constructed in 1976 according to plans by

architect Gerhard Keller, the building additionally serves as an excellent example of 1970s style architecture. It was renovated from the ground up between 2004 and 2006, including the addition of a 1 000 square meter annex. The result was a multifaceted and versatile space for various festivals, events and congresses, delighting not only with its variable compositions and top-class events, but also with its very special ambiance.

6 | MUSIC SCHOOL

The city of Fellbach's music school hits the right note visually as well: one of the architectural highlights is its kidney-shaped orchestra hall, which has also become a Fellbach landmark. Today nearly 1 000 school kids attend the school. An interesting sculpture by the artist Andrea Zaumseil can also be found in its spaciouly planned forecourt.
